Is the Vulnerable Adults Pathway (VAP) for me?

At VAP we support adults with a range of issues, such as mental health, autistic spectrum disorder, mild learning disabilities and offending behaviour. Our aim is for customers to establish and maintain independence in a home where they feel safe and secure. Our project includes:

- Support and accommodation for up to 110 individuals, including 26 accommodation units
- Tailored support packages to suit our customers needs and aspirations
- A friendly staff team who deliver one to one and group support sessions
- Telephone support.

How do I access the VAP service?

The VAP project is part of Action's Adult Support Services, operating in the Rotherham area. To access this service you must be aged 18-65 and living in Rotherham. People wishing to access the service must be actively engaging with other support.

- Mental Health Worker
- GP Practitioner
- Advice and Support Services
- You can also self refer.
